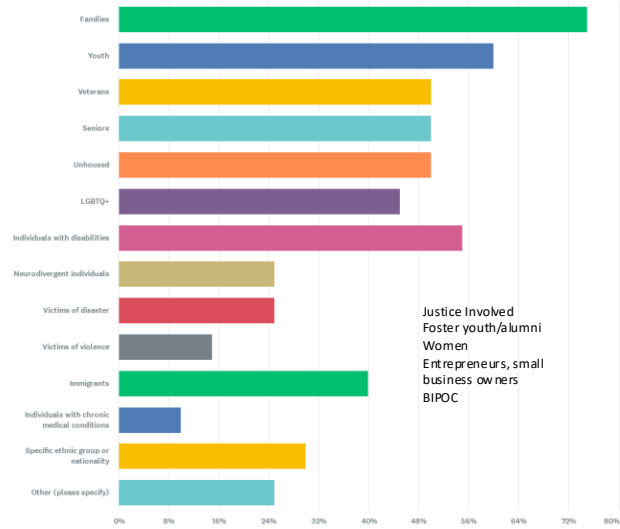

Parkview Legacy Foundation's Four Focus Areas

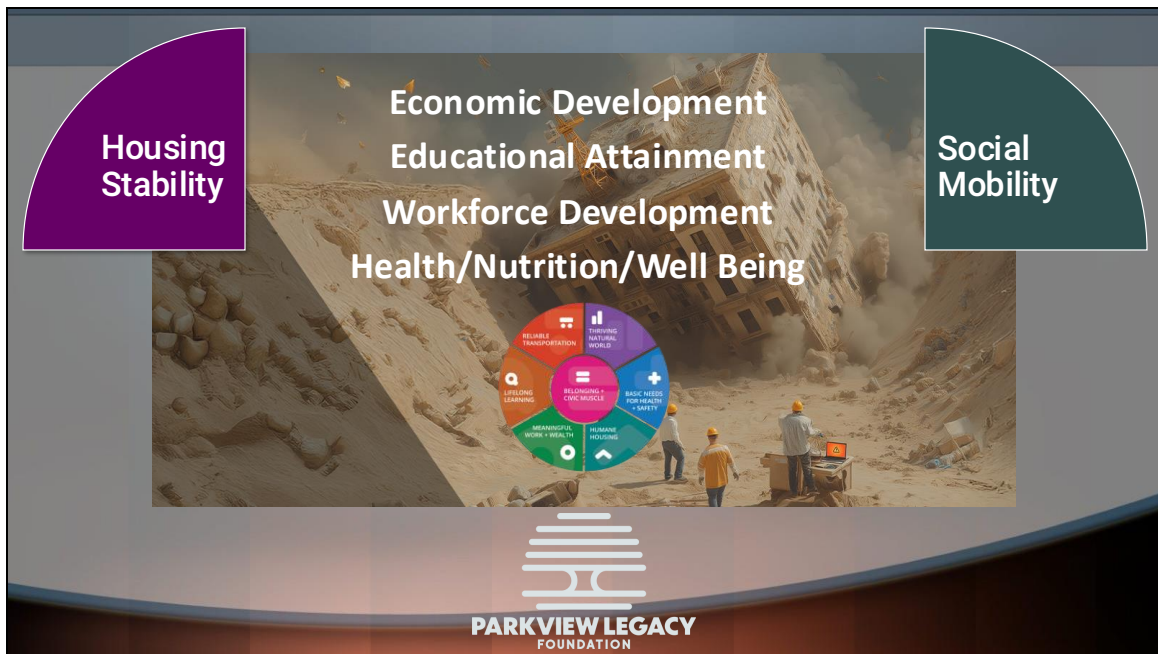


Why are these issues worth focusing our energy on? Quick stats on Housing and Poverty in our region.



We are focusing our attention specifically on a particular expression of Poverty--
Generational Poverty verse Situational Poverty

We don't see any reason that generational poverty has to exist in our country. Generational poverty has been created and sustained by our policies and practices; and those can be changed.



Without addressing our housing/housing affordability crisis and issues related to, creating, and sustaining generational poverty, all of our other efforts are being built on quicksand for those impacted by them.

Generational Poverty gets in the way of our efforts and ESPECIALLY the efforts of those impacted by it in many ways.

What I have experienced is being in many if not most conversations we are in trying to address problems or advance goals on issues that are somehow if not directly impacted or created by issues involving generational poverty without the concept or impacts of generational poverty ever being brought up or considered in the conversations. This includes conversations about community development, education, economic development, health, incarceration, homelessness, food insecurity and any number of other social supports.

This, in no way, makes efforts to address these issues of any less importance, but

It's our hypothesis that failing to consider how generational poverty impacts our efforts and the success of those whom we are serving is a missed opportunity to

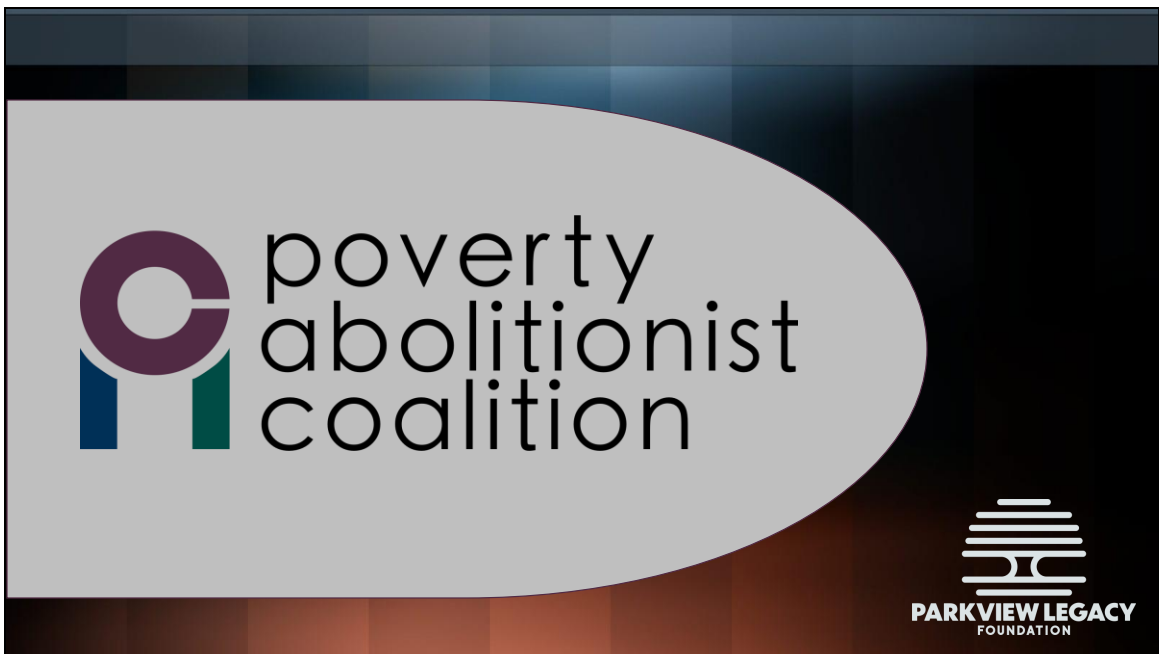
address at least some of the underlying issues that result in the symptoms we are trying to treat or in the challenges we encounter in reaching our goals as well as the challenges those whom we are trying to benefit encounter in reaching their goals.



As a result, we also suspect that sometimes our efforts are designed in a way that makes all the sense in the world for particular situations, but that fail to be designed or implemented in ways that make the most sense for those impacted by generational poverty or who are stuck in its cycles. So while they might be great or brilliant efforts, they are not necessarily so great for those individuals and families.

There are a lot of examples of how this can and often is so that we can explore at a later time, but the bottom line is that we want to change that.

It seems to us that more work is needed to design programs, policies, and other efforts that reflect the dynamic impacts generational poverty has on people, systems, and society. And that that work needs to extend to some of society's biggest systems – like education, health care, and the labor market – so that the landscape in which those impacted make their journey prioritizes their success.



Our hope in forming this coalition is we want to make it more probable that EVERY individual and family in our region can exit cycles of generational poverty and create generational wealth for their families.

We hope to do that not simply by treating the impacts of poverty, but by abolishing it over time.

That, it seems to us, starts by getting together with people who would love the same and figuring out together how we can:



Ensure that the impacts and obstacles that generational poverty produces in the lives of people within our community are considered in every effort and conversation for which they are necessary and appropriate.

Abolish generational poverty by doing what needs to be done not only at the individual level, but at the organizational, institutional, community, policy, and systems level as well.

We think that this distinction in whatever it is that we do is important because our experience is that conversations that do consider helping individuals and families exit cycles of generational poverty often start and stop either only with a focus on the individual level (changes that individuals can make in their lives – which are often also approached in ways that assume that those individuals are in some way deficient) or only with a focus on policies or legislation.

Those are both important parts of the equation (if we approach the individual level approaches with a less objectifying and more asset based lens and approach), but we also need to address the other layers. ... Organizational, Institutions, Community, and Systems.

That's our goal.

We know that its extremely aspirational and the solutions will be more than

complicated, they'll be complex. There's no single effort or single approach that will work, every person's and all of our sub-population's needs as well as the forces working both for and against us are different.

And that's why we need a coalition. We're hoping that you'll join us in this journey so that we can learn from you, support you, and work with you on this dream.

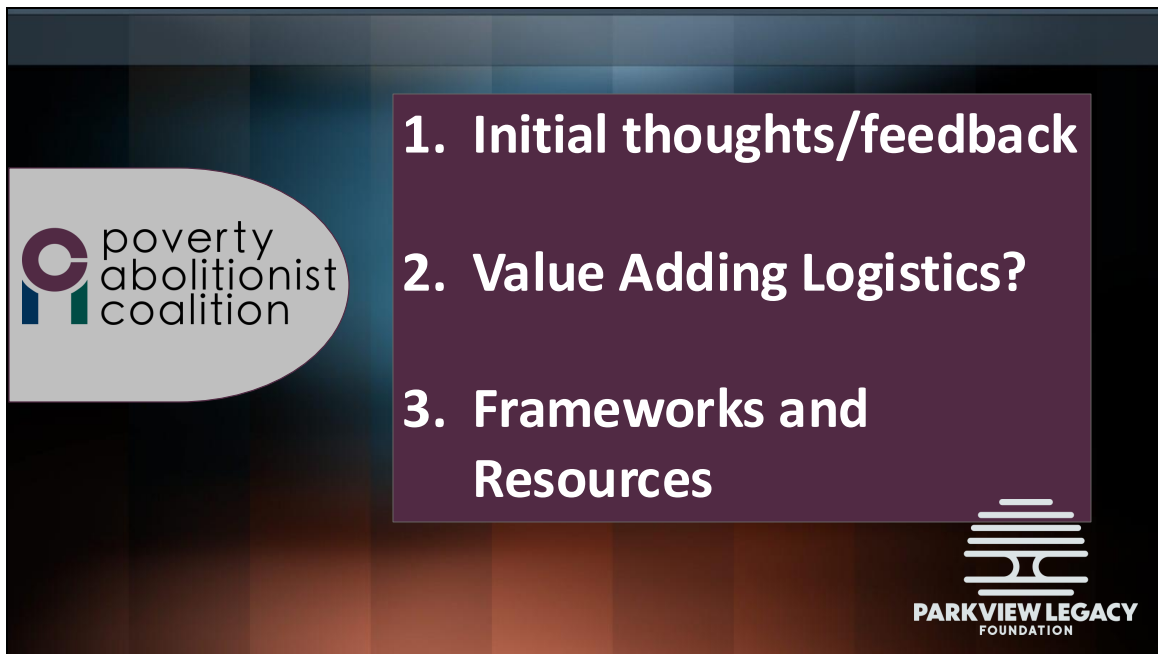


We envision several options for your involvement depending on what makes the most sense for you:

The most important level of involvement is membership... (Attend – Share What You Know, Learn From One Another, Discover what we can do within in our own work and orgs and what we can do together)

The second option we envision is the option of engaging with us as a Strategy Partner. (Organize what we are learning and help us figure out strategic next steps.)

An additional option is being a supporter/sponsor... (For those that support the concept and want to help fuel it beyond or in lieu of your active participation)



Where we go from here really depends on who's with us informing the process.

There are plenty of resources and experiences that have informed my thinking on this, and there are also several different frameworks that we can use or borrow from in this effort that we look forward to sharing; and I fully suspect that that you have others to add to the conversation as well – and we look forward to learning about them.

So what we'd like to do with the rest of our time today is the following:

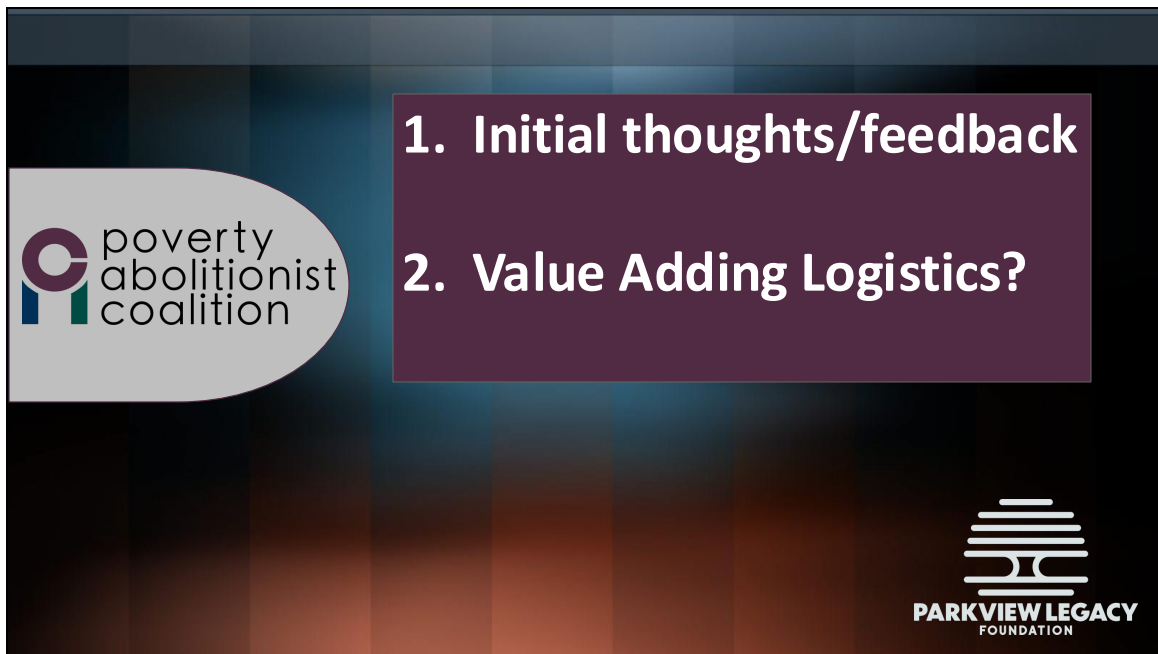
1. Get initial thoughts and feedback from you on what we've shared.

1. Initial thoughts/feedback



Initial Thoughts and Feedback from the Attendees:

- Need to inform the public about the existence of organizations, how best to accomplish this
- Need to advocate and think strategically together; eliminate silos
- Focus on banking practices, development of skills and workforce development based on local industry needs
- Shine a magnifying glass to how we see everything, i.e. Barbara Kingsolver interest in strategy; part of the Vital Conditions Network as a multi-solver network
- Investigate portals that advertise services – Public Health Alliance, Building Resilient Communities - Inland Equity Grid (IEG) ieg.healthyplacesindex.org
- Investigate frameworks that include race, class, gender; practice versus theory; center values; base work on data; “collaboration moves at the speed of trust”
- Educate on what each member does; determine what success looks like in a year and where we are heading; shared values lead to shared purpose
- Reduce the cost of being poor; create mobility pathways
- Create a movement, action/verb; develop a common language; investigate how we understand systemic racism; something with people not for people

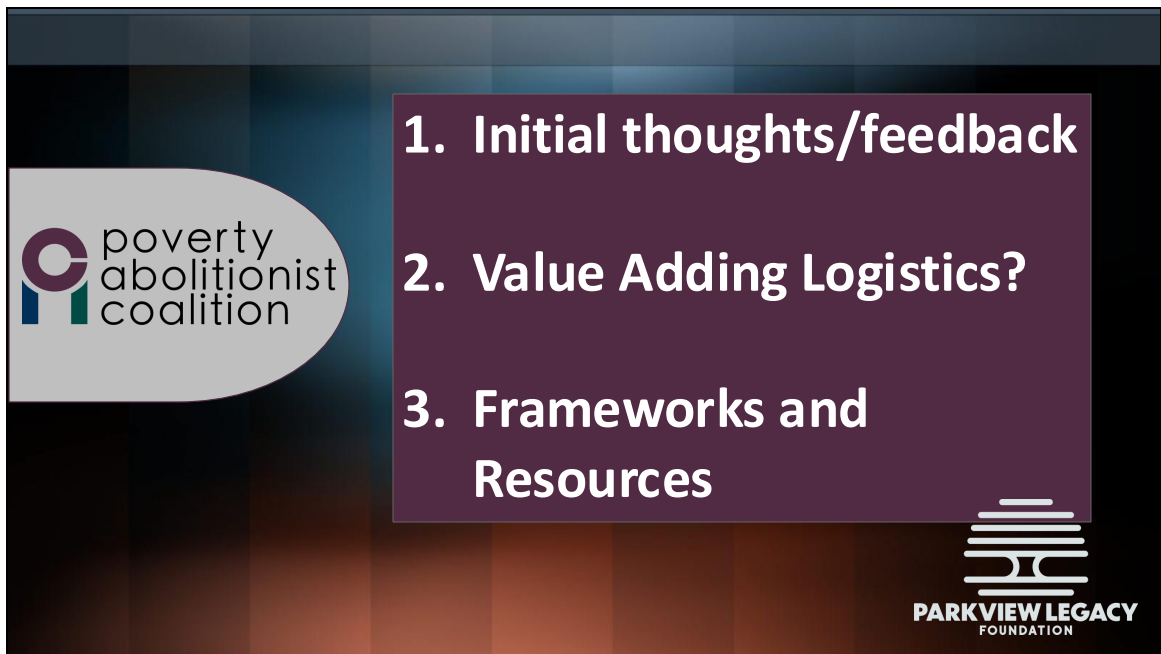

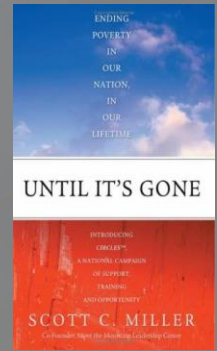
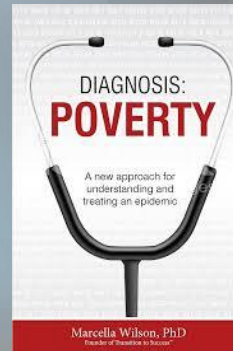


Top, right framework is from Urban Institute's Asset-based Model
